SHOW RULES

1. The Judge's decision is final. Any complaints regarding the judge's decision will not be accepted.
2. All ages for both horse & rider are taken from the 1st of January in the current year. All riders/handlers must have attained their 3rd birthday on the date of the show. All ridden horse/ponies must be at least 4yrs old to compete in any ridden class.
3. The centre reserves the right to alter, amalgamate or cancel classes if sufficient/insufficient entries.
4. Hard Hats to current BSI standards with a chin strap to be worn in all ridden classes and in-hand classes by handlers 16 years and under.
5. No refund of entries will be allowed under any circumstances. Entries may be moved to an alternative class or date dependent on circumstances at the secretary's discretion.
6. The organisers accept no responsibility or liability for any loss, incident or accident(s) to persons, equines or property.
7. All competitors must hold a minimum of third-party liability insurance.
8. No mucking out of horseboxes on the showground.
9. No tying up to horseboxes or trailers and absolutely no hay nets outside of vehicles.
10. The Centre reserves the right to ask anyone demonstrating cruelty or anti-social behaviour to leave the showground and will be banned from any future events.
11. If you are not present when your class is due to start, then you will not be allowed into the ring once the class has started. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that they do not miss their class. There will be no refunds if any class is missed.
12. Novice classes – Please enter this class in the spirit that it is intended.
13. No spurs are allowed to be worn by any competitor under the age of 16yrs in any class. Any competitor over the age of 16yrs may wear spurs if riding a horse exceeding 148cms and if the class allows it.
14. No form of bullying, harassment or nasty comments, whether in person or on social media will not be tolerated and any person found to be doing so will be banned from all events and removed from the showground immediately.
15. Foals must be at least 30 days old on the show day.
16. No horse/pony to be left tied to a trailer/lorry unattended.
17. All stallions and colts 2 years+ must be bitted. Age of handlers for stallions or colts, or riders of stallions as follows: Stallions/Colts not exceeding 13.2hh- minimum age of handler/rider 12yrs. Stallions/Colts 13.2hh and over – minimum age of handler/rider 14yrs.
18. Lead rein handlers must be at least 16 years of age.
19. Take all rubbish & waste home.
20. When attending the show, please respect our liveryies by remaining off the yards and no wandering around the premises.
21. Whips: Maximum length of 75cm (30") in all classes.
22. SJ and WH heights are at Judge's discretion.
23. Lead rein ponies to be shown in snaffle bridle and lead rein to be attached to the noseband.
24. Lead rein competitors to be 9 years and under (age at 1st January 2024)
25. First Ridden competitors to be 12 years and under (age at 1st January 2024)
26. All mounted/in hand horses and ponies must be shown in appropriate tack.
27. All competitors to wear correct and appropriate show attire for the classes they wish to enter.
28. If a rider or horse is involved in a fall then this should be reported to the show secretary on the day.
29. All earrings and body studs to be removed before entering any ring as a competitor.
30. Regardless of age, the rider must be a suitable height/weight for the horse/pony, including lead rein. If the judge deems a horse and rider combination inappropriate; they will be dismissed from the class. No refunds will be made. The judge's decision is final.
31. Parking is available on the showground at your own risk. The Committee accept no responsibility for damage to vehicles or its contents.
32. The Committee reserves the right to omit classes from future shows if insufficient entries.
33. Objections- £50.00 to be deposited to a committee member within 30 minutes of the incident. Written confirmation produced within 7 days, £50.00 will be returned if the objection is upheld.

34. If these rules cannot be adhered to then competitors will be asked to leave the showground with no refund of entries.
35. No rider may ride more than one pony/horse in a class.
36. There may be no change of rider from phase one to phase two.
37. All classes that are points classes will have a (P) next to the description.

Jumping Rules to apply:

- a) Riders are allowed to walk the course dismounted before their class.
- b) Ponies/horses are not allowed to practice over any part of the course before the commencement of any of the classes.
- c) No person, other than the Judge or the Course Builder appointed by the Show, is permitted to alter the course.
- d) If a combination or double fence is numbered as one fence, penalties incurred at each element are cumulative.
- e) Any pony/horse taking the wrong course or jumping another fence after completing the course will be eliminated.
- f) If a pony/horse positively stops, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround these constitute refusals. If a pony/horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Ponies/horses displaying continued disobedience, or ponies/horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.
- g) No penalty is incurred unless the max. height of the fence is lowered in the same vertical plane.
(FALL OFF = ELIMINATION)
(STEP BACK = REFUSAL)
(2 STOPS = ELIMINATION SJ)
(3 STOPS = ELIMINATION WH)

Dress/Tack Code to apply:

- a) There is no requirement for a change of tack for horses/ponies during the Working Hunter classes although bridles should be plain with no colour.
- b) No bandages or schooling aids to be worn on the horse.
- c) Boots of a plain colour may be used for Phase I of the W.H.P./W.H. Classes, but they must be removed before the conformation section.
- d) A body protector can be worn if necessary.
- f) Hard hats to current BSA standards with chin strap must be worn.

Entry Rules to apply:

- a) Entry fees are due at the time of booking.
- b) Entry fees are non-refundable.
- c) All times are approximate and subject to alteration.
- d) Competitors must declare at the working hunter ring.

SUMMER MEMBERSHIP & POINTS LEAGUE

1st March 2024 – 30th September 2024

Competitors who enter classes as members are eligible for points. To qualify for points in a class, you must compete in the same class a minimum of THREE times with the same rider/handler and horse/pony combination. Points are awarded to every competitor present. Any member in any class that is not placed will receive 1 point.

THIS SHOW IS A QUALIFIER FOR SELSTON EQUINE OF THE YEAR SHOW 2024. THE FINAL WILL BE HELD ON 5-6TH OCTOBER 2024 AT SELSTON EQUESTRIAN CENTRE. 1ST & 2ND PRIZEWINNERS IN EACH CLASS STANDARD CLASS WILL QUALIFY FOR THE FINAL.

This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at the Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st – 4th August 2024. The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

This show is affiliated to Equine Sports UK (ESUK) Grassroots Championships taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire in August 2024. The three highest placed exhibits will qualify in each class.

This show is a qualifier for the N.C.P.A. Pony of the Year Show in September. First and second prize winners in appropriate classes will qualify.

Show is affiliated to The Rescue Equine Showing Society final taking place at the Equifest, **Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st – 4th August 2024. The **two** highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify. **Definition of Rescue:** Any equine that is adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any National Equine Welfare Council registered Charity (NEWC). Any equine that has been adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any other equine charity (must be registered with the Charity Commission). Any equine that has been 'independently' rescued by an individual. There must be supporting evidence (photographic, veterinary) that will be included in the 'Rescue History' for the equine, to demonstrate their rescue status.**

Mark System: The mark system is designed to reward those equines that have the strongest rescue history and most dramatic 'transformation'. Marks are awarded as follows:

Rescue History and Transformation - 60%

Performance - 40%

In the event of a tie, the Rescue History and Transformation takes precedence. All entries are asked to provide, on entry to the class, a written 'Rescue History', detailing the background and history of the equine. Also, to be included are 'before' and 'after' photographs. This will be for the Judge to discuss with the competitor during the Judging of the Class and marks awarded accordingly. (A template for the layout for this Rescue History can be found on the Rescue Equine Showing Society website).

This show is a qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championships held at The All-England Showground, Hickstead from September 2024. The Championships are for unaffiliated and amateur competitors in Dressage from Intro to Elementary, Show Jumping from Lead Rein to 1.05m; Showing for lead rein, in-hand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more. Qualification: Dressage & Show Jumping 1st – 3rd place; Showing 1st – 4th place. Qualification does not pass down the line. Visit www.sunshinetour.co.uk for more information, to register and submit evidence of results. Registration must be completed within 1 month of qualification (sooner for late July shows). Restrictions apply to horse and competitor's previous winnings and amateur status, please check the website www.sunshinetour.co.uk for Terms & Conditions.

1. Inhand Cob – Any age. Traditional, hogged, native. (P)
2. Inhand Hunter & Irish Draft – Any age. Part & pure bred ID. Must be plaited. (P)
3. Inhand Horse – Any age & type. Exceeding 14.2hh at maturity. (P)
4. Inhand ROR – Must be shown plaited. (P)
5. Inhand Show Horse - Show horses to exceed 14.2hh at maturity. Hack and riding horse types. Must be shown plaited. (P)
6. Inhand Veteran – Horse/pony 15 years old and over. Any height, any type. (P)
7. Inhand Coloured – Any age, any height. Unusual coloureds welcome. (P)

In-hand Championship 1.

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1 to 7 are eligible to compete.

Not Before 10:30am.

8. Inhand Pony – Any age & type. Not exceeding 14.2hh at maturity. (P)
9. Inhand Youngstock – any type, horses and ponies up to 3 years of age. (P)
10. Inhand M&M – Will be judged separately (Small & Large breeds). Any age, any height. Must be shown in their natural state. (P)

11. Inhand Show Pony or Show Hunter Pony – Show ponies not to exceed 14.2hh at maturity. Show hunter ponies not to exceed 15hh at maturity. Must be shown plaited. (P)
12. Inhand Novice Horse or Pony – Any height, any type, any age. Horses / ponies must be in their first season of inhand showing. (P)
13. Inhand New Combination – Any height, any age, any type. Combination must be competing in their first full season together. (P)
14. Young Handler – Horse or pony any height. Mares & geldings. Will be split for placings if sufficient entries. (Under 8 years, 8-12 years & 12-18 years). (P)
15. RESS Rescue Open Inhand – Any age, type, breed. Mares with foal at foot are not permitted. No exhibit under the age of one year may be exhibited.

In-hand Championship 2.

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 8 to 15 are eligible to compete.

RING 1 – Ridden

MINI SECTION

16. Lead-rein – 4 years old and over. Lead-rein riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before the 1st Jan 2021. Mares & geldings. (P)
17. First ridden – 4 years old and over. First ridden riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st Jan 2021. Mares & geldings. (P)
18. Tiny Tots Lead-rein & First Ridden – Riders not to have attained their 8th birthday. Mares & geldings. Will be split for placings if sufficient entries. (P)
19. Mini Equitation - Lead rein welcome. To be judged on the rider's seat and aids, position, suitability of partnership and overall impression. Ponies not to exceed 14.2hh. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday. Mares & Geldings. (P)

Mini Championship

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 16 to 19 are eligible to compete.

NOVICE RIDDEN

Not Before 1:30pm.

20. Ridden Pre-Novice walk & trot ponies – 4 years old and over. Ponies not to exceed 148cms. Snaffle bridles only. Walk & trot on go-round only. Canter in show optional.
21. Ridden Pre-Novice walk & trot horses – 4 years old and over. Horses exceeding 148cms. Snaffle bridles only. Walk & trot on go-round only. Canter in show optional.
22. Ridden Novice 4, 5 & 6 year olds – open to any horse or pony aged 4, 5 or 6 years old.
23. Ridden Novice rider – open to any pony or horse 4 years old and over. Nervous/novice riders only.
24. Ridden most promising new combination – 4 years old and over. Any type, any height. Horses & ponies. To be in their first full show season together.

Novice ridden Championship.

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 20 to 24 are eligible to compete.

OPEN RIDDEN

Not Before 2:30pm

25. Riding Club Pony or Horse – Rider any age. This class will be judged on suitability of combination, style, manners & way of going. A small jump or two may be included at the judge's discretion. (P)
26. Equitation - To be judged on performance only. Horses and ponies any height. Riders to have attained their 12th birthday. To be judged on the rider's seat and aids, position, suitability of partnership and overall impression. (P)
27. Ridden M&M – Will be judged separately (Small & Large breeds). 4 years old and over, any height. Must be shown in their natural state. (P)
28. Junior Rider – 4 years old and over. All riders 18 years and under. Ponies 15hh and under. Any breed, any type. (P)
29. Open Pony – not exceeding 14.2hh. ponies 4 years old and over. (P)
30. Ridden Show Pony or Show Hunter Pony - Show ponies not to exceed 14.2hh. Show hunter ponies not to exceed 15hh. Must be shown plaited. (P)
31. Ridden Coloured – Any type. 4 years old and over. Unusual colours welcome. Plaited, native, hogged or traditional. (P)

32. Ridden Veteran – 15 years and over. (P)
33. Ridden Hunter Horse/Irish Draft – 4 years old and over. Part/pure bred ID welcome. (P)
34. Ridden Show Horse - Show horses to exceed 14.2hh. Hack and riding horse types. Must be shown plaited. (P)
35. Ridden ROR – 4 years old and over. (P)
36. Open Horse – exceeding 14.2hh. horses 4 years old and over. (P)
37. Ridden Cob – Hogged or traditional types. (P)
38. RESS Rescue Open Ridden – Any type or breed, four years and over. Lead rein & first ridden permitted. All riders must be the appropriate height and weight for their equine.

Open Ridden Championship

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 25 to 38 are eligible to compete.

39. **Lead Rein** – Pony must be 128cm or under. Rider not to have attained their 10th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. Max jump height 30cms. (P)
40. **Tiny Tots** – Off the lead. Pony must be 128cm or under. Rider not to have attained their 10th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. Max jump height 40cms. (P)
41. **Training Stakes** – 60cms. Open to all horses & ponies, any age, height or type. Rider any age.

42. **Mountain & Moorland 133cms and Under** - Rider any age, suitable for the height of the pony. Max jump height 60cms. Pony must be shown in natural state. (P)
43. **Under 133cm** – Rider any age, suitable for the height of the pony. Max jump height 65cms. Pony must be plaited or hogged. (P)

Not Before 11am.

44. **Training Stakes** – 70cms. Open to all horses & ponies, any age, height or type. Rider any age.
45. **Mountain & Moorland Over 133cms** - Rider any age, suitable for the height of the pony. Max jump height 75cms. Pony must be shown in natural state. (P)
46. **133cms to 153cms** – Rider any age, suitable for the height of the pony. Max jump height 75cms. Pony must be plaited or hogged. (P)
47. **Exceeding 153cm** – Rider any age, suitable for the height of the pony. Max jump height 90cm. Pony must be plaited or hogged. (P)

Working Hunter Championship

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 39 to 47 are eligible to compete.
