SHOW RULES

1. The Judge's decision is final. Any complaints regarding the judge's decision will not be accepted.
2. All ages for both horse & rider are taken from the 1st of January in the current year. All riders/handlers must have attained their 3rd birthday on the date of the show. All ridden horse/ponies must be at least 4yrs old to compete in any ridden class.
3. The centre reserves the right to alter, amalgamate or cancel classes if sufficient/insufficient entries.
4. Hard Hats to current BSI standards with a chin strap to be worn in all ridden classes and in-hand classes by handlers 16 years and under.
5. No refund of entries will be allowed under any circumstances.
6. The organisers accept no responsibility or liability for any loss, incident or accident(s) to persons, equines or property.
7. All competitors must hold a minimum of third-party liability insurance.
8. No mucking out of horseboxes on the showground.
9. The Centre reserves the right to ask anyone demonstrating cruelty or anti-social behaviour to leave the showground and will be banned from any future events.
10. If you are not present when your class is due to start, then you will not be allowed into the ring once the class has started. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that they do not miss their class. There will be no refunds if any class is missed.
11. Novice classes – Please enter this class in the spirit that it is intended.
12. No spurs are allowed to be worn by any competitor under the age of 16yrs in any class. Any competitor over the age of 16yrs may wear spurs if riding a horse exceeding 148cms and if the class allows it.
13. No form of bullying, harassment or nasty comments, whether in person or on social media will not be tolerated and any person found to be doing so will be banned from all events and removed from the showground immediately.
14. Foals must be at least 30 days old on the show day.
15. NO POINTS shall be accumulated from the youngstock classes.
16. No horse/pony to be left tied to a trailer/lorry unattended.
17. All stallions and colts 2 years+ must be bitted. Age of handlers for stallions or colts, or riders of stallions as follows: Stallions/Colts not exceeding 13.2hh- minimum age of handler/rider 12yrs. Stallions/Colts 13.2hh and over – minimum age of handler/rider 14yrs.
18. Lead rein handlers must be at least 16 years of age.
19. Take all rubbish & waste home.
20. When attending the show, please respect our livery by remaining off the yards and no wandering around the premises.
21. Whips: Maximum length of 75cm (30") in all classes.
22. SJ and WH heights are at Judge's discretion.
23. Lead rein ponies to be shown in snaffle bridle and lead rein to be attached to the noseband.
24. Lead rein competitors to be 9 years and under (age at 1st January 2024)
25. First Ridden competitors to be 12 years and under (age at 1st January 2024)
26. All mounted/in hand horses and ponies must be shown in appropriate tack.
27. All competitors to wear correct and appropriate show attire for the classes they wish to enter.
28. If a rider or horse is involved in a fall then this should be reported to the show secretary on the day.
29. All earrings and body studs to be removed before entering any ring as a competitor.
30. Regardless of age, the rider must be a suitable height/weight for the horse/pony, including lead rein. If the judge deems a horse and rider combination inappropriate; they will be dismissed from the class. No refunds will be made. The judge's decision is final.
31. The winner of the Novice Showing Class at the end of year presentation will no longer be eligible to enter and will be de-noviced.
32. Parking is available on the showground at your own risk. The Committee accept no responsibility for damage to vehicles or its contents
33. The Committee reserves the right to omit classes from future shows if insufficient entries.
34. Objections- £50.00 to be deposited to a committee member within 30 minutes of the incident. Written confirmation produced within 7 days, £50.00 will be returned if the objection is upheld.

35. If these rules cannot be adhered to then competitors will be asked to leave the showground with no refund of entries.
36. No rider may ride more than one pony/horse in a class.
37. There may be no change of rider from phase one to phase two.

Jumping Rules to apply:

- a) Riders are allowed to walk the course dismounted before their class.
- b) Ponies/horses are not allowed to practice over any part of the course before the commencement of any of the classes.
- c) No person, other than the Judge or the Course Builder appointed by the Show, is permitted to alter the course.
- d) If a combination or double fence is numbered as one fence, penalties incurred at each element are cumulative.
- e) Any pony/horse taking the wrong course or jumping another fence after completing the course will be eliminated.
- f) If a pony/horse positively stops, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround these constitute refusals. If a pony/horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Ponies/horses displaying continued disobedience, or ponies/horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.
- g) No penalty is incurred unless the max. height of the fence is lowered in the same vertical plane.
(FALL OFF = ELIMINATION)
(STEP BACK = REFUSAL)
(2 STOPS = ELIMINATION SJ)
(3 STOPS = ELIMINATION WH)

Dress/Tack Code to apply:

- a) There is no requirement for a change of tack for horses/ponies during the Working Hunter classes although bridles should be plain with no colour.
- b) No bandages or schooling aids to be worn on the horse.
- c) Boots of a plain colour may be used for Phase I of the W.H.P./W.H. Classes, but they must be removed before the conformation section.
- d) A body protector can be worn if necessary.
- f) Hard hats to current BSA standards with chin strap must be worn.

Entry Rules to apply:

- a) Entry fees are due at the time of booking.
- b) Entry fees are non-refundable.
- c) All times are approximate and subject to alteration.
- d) Competitors must declare at the working hunter ring.

TGCA TOYS In Hand and Ridden Classes Affiliation Number 24/3003/STQ. No known breeding required to enter these classes TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is bred traditional gypsy cob. Stallions – All stallions (four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook. Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook). Championships Quest for a

Star Championship - TGC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule. ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Member's qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. Go for Glory Championship - PB -1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

THIS SHOW IS A QUALIFIER FOR SELSTON EQUINE OF THE YEAR SHOW 2024. THE FINAL WILL BE HELD ON 5-6TH OCTOBER 2024 AT SELSTON EQUESTRIAN CENTRE. 1ST & 2ND PRIZEWINNERS IN EACH CLASS STANDARD CLASS WILL QUALIFY FOR THE FINAL.

BSPS Classes: All Rules as per the 2024 B.S.P.S. Rule & Show Handbook. All ponies must be four years old or over. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed ponies in the Novice Classes will qualify and in mixed height Novice classes 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prize winners will qualify. In the Open (Challenge) Classes the qualification will be awarded to the three highest placed Challenge animals in each class, and in the mixed height Open (Challenge) classes the four highest placed Challenge animals will qualify, (riders on Challenge animals MUST wear an armband). Animals must be registered before the date of the Show at which they qualify for the Winter Championships and must be ridden by B.S.P.S. Members, except in the case of exhibitors who have never been members before who are allowed 7 days in which to become members and register their ponies.

NPS Winter Championship Qualifying Rounds This show is affiliated to the National Pony Society and the NPS affiliated classes will be run under NPS rules. Classes are open to Members and Non-Members of the NPS, but Non-Members will need to become members to enter the finals at the NPS Spring Festival 2024. The NPS General Rules for Showing apply (see NPS website for details). In each class the three highest placed ponies, not already qualified, within the first six places, will qualify. Winnings in the 2023/2024 Novice and Pure Novice Winter Championships will not debar ponies from the NPS 2024 Mountain and Moorland Novice Ridden competitions. Qualification cards will be awarded in the ring.

CHAPS (UK) SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFIERS 2024 – AFFILIATION NUMBER 24-087. BOTH THE OWNER AND THE RIDER OF ANY EXHIBIT NEED NOT BE FULLY PAID-UP MEMBERS OF CHAPS (UK) AT THE TIME OF COMPETITION, NOR MUST THE ANIMAL BE REGISTERED; HOWEVER, TO QUALIFY BOTH OWNER & RIDER NEED TO BE A CURRENT MEMBER OF CHAPS UK AND HAVE A VALID QUALIFICATION CARD. MEMBERSHIP / REGISTRATIONS FROM: CHAPS (UK) ADMIN, 1 MCLAREN COTTAGES, ABERTYSSWG, RHYMNEY, TREDEGAR NP22 5BH. ALL STALLIONS MUST BE GRADED WITH CHAPS (UK) IN ORDER TO COMPETE IN THESE CLASSES. (No Lead Reins are permitted).

This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at the Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st – 4th August 2024. The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

This show is affiliated to Equine Sports UK (ESUK) Grassroots Championships taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire in August 2024. The three highest placed exhibits will qualify in each class.

This show is a qualifier for the N.C.P.A. Pony of the Year Show in September. First and second prize winners in appropriate classes will qualify.

This show is a qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championships held at The All-England Showground, Hickstead from September 2024. The Championships are for unaffiliated and amateur competitors in Dressage from Intro to Elementary, Show Jumping from Lead Rein to 1.05m; Showing for lead rein, in-hand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more. Qualification: Dressage & Show Jumping 1st – 3rd place; Showing 1st – 4th place. Qualification does not pass down the line. Visit www.sunshinetour.co.uk for more information, to

register and submit evidence of results. Registration must be completed within 1 month of qualification (sooner for late July shows). Restrictions apply to horse and competitor's previous winnings and amateur status, please check the website www.sunshinetour.co.uk for Terms & Conditions.

1. **CHAPS UK Youngstock** – Open to any height & any type. Yearlings, two-year-olds or three-year-olds. No foals. Qualification will go to the highest placed yearling, two-year-old and three-year-old irrespective of rosette placing.
2. **CHAPS UK Open Inhand Non-Native** – Open to non-native exhibits, any height, any age. No foals. Qualification will be awarded to the highest placed CHAPS UK registered eligible exhibit exceeding or likely to exceed 153cms and the highest placed exhibit not exceeding or likely to exceed 153cm which have not already qualified.
3. **CHAPS UK Open Inhand Native, Cob, Traditional** - Open to native, cob, traditional, vanner exhibits, any height, any age. No foals. Qualification will be awarded to the highest placed CHAPS UK registered eligible exhibit exceeding or likely to exceed 153cms and the highest placed exhibit not exceeding or likely to exceed 153cm which have not already qualified.

CHAPS (UK) Inhand championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1-3 to compete.

4. **CHAPS UK Novice Horse or Pony** – Open to any height & any type. 4 years and over. Not to have won any open class before the 1st January 2024. Any suitable bridle.
5. **CHAPS UK Open Ridden Non-Native** – Open to non-native exhibits, any height, 4 years and over. Qualification will be awarded to the 3 highest placed CHAPS UK registered eligible exhibits which have not already qualified.
6. **CHAPS UK Open Ridden Native, Cob, Traditional** - Open to native, cob, traditional, vanner exhibits, any height, 4 years and over. Qualification will be awarded to the 3 highest placed CHAPS UK registered eligible exhibits which have not already qualified.
7. **CHAPS UK Junior and Intermediate Rider of the Year** - Open to native and non-native types. Any height. Riders not to have attained their 18th Birthday (Junior) or 25th birthday (Intermediate) before the 1st January 2024.

- 9. Ridden Pre-Novice walk & trot horses** – 4 years old and over. Horses exceeding 148cms. Snaffle bridles only. Walk & trot on go-round only. Canter in show optional.
- 10. Ridden Novice 4, 5 & 6 year olds** – open to any horse or pony aged 4, 5 or 6 years old.
- 11. Ridden Novice rider** – open to any pony or horse 4 years old and over. Nervous/novice riders only.
- 12. Ridden most promising new combination** – 4 years old and over. Any type, any height. Horses & ponies. To be in their first full show season together.

Novice ridden Championship. - All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 8 to 12 are eligible to compete.

All classes are open to traditional gypsy cobs, which are of any colour and meet the TGCA breed standard.

- 14. In Hand Senior** – Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over.
- 15. Ridden** - Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over.

TGCA Quest for a Star Championship – 1st, 2nd & 3rd from the TGCA classes 13, 14 & 15 may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship. Only current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card & member's qualification card must be presented upon entry into the ring. The champion & reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. The Greatest Gelding Award: This award will be given to the highest placed gelding within the championship.

TGCA QUALIFYING CLASSES – TOYS PART BRED FINALS

Pony not to have been placed first in any Ridden Mountain & Moorland Class (excluding Lead Rein or First Ridden) before 1st September in the current season. All ponies in this class must be shown in a snaffle bit. Rider any age (except stallions – see NPS Rules).

19. NPS/Freestep M&M Pure Novice Ridden Small Breeds – Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A & Welsh B.

20. NPS/Freestep M&M Pure Novice Ridden Large Breeds - Highland, Fell, Dales, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh C & Welsh D.

NPS/CASTLEFORD STUD M&M CONFINED NOVICE RIDDEN WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP

This Competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings four years old or over which must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Book. Pony not to have won a first prize of £10 or more in any open Ridden M&M Class before 1st September in the current season. Rider any age (except stallions – see NPS Rules).

21. NPS/Castleford Stud M&M Confined Novice Ridden Small Breeds – Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A & Welsh B.

22. NPS/Castleford Stud M&M Confined Novice Ridden Large Breeds - Highland, Fell, Dales, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh C & Welsh D.

The NPS Pure & Confined Novice Ridden Championship - All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 19 to 22 are eligible to compete.

NPS/CE FULLER & SON M&M OPEN RIDDEN WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP

This Competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over which must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Book. Rider any age (except stallions – see NPS Rules).

23. NPS/CE Fuller & Son Open Ridden Small Breeds – Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A & Welsh B.

24. NPS/CE Fuller & Son Open Ridden Large Breeds - Highland, Fell, Dales, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh C & Welsh D.

The NPS Open Ridden Championship - All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 23 & 24 are eligible to compete.

NPS NOVICE MINI WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP

25. NPS/Marion Williams Memorial M&M Novice Leading Rein- This Competition is open to mares and geldings four years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Book. Not exceeding 122cms. Pony not to have won a first prize in any Leading Rein class before 1st September in the current season. To be shown in a snaffle bit, the leading rein must be attached to the noseband only. The reins must go directly from the bit to the rider's hands. (Riders must not have attained their 9th birthday by 1st January in the current year).

26. NPS/Area 25 M&M Novice First Ridden – Open to mares and geldings four years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Book. Not exceeding 128cms. Pony not to have won a first prize in any First Ridden class before 1st September in the current season. Ponies must not be cantered except in their individual show. (Riders must not have attained their 12th birthday by 1st January in the current year).

NPS OPEN MINI WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP

27. NPS M&M Open Leading Rein - This Competition is open to mares and geldings four years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Book. Not exceeding 122cms. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bit, the leading rein to be attached to the noseband only. The reins must go directly from the bit to the rider's hands. (Riders must not have attained their 9th birthday by 1st January in the current year).

28. NPS M&M Open First Ridden – This Competition is open to mares and geldings four years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Book. Not exceeding 128cms. (Riders must not have attained their 12th birthday by 1st January in the current year).

The NPS Mini Championship - All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 25 to 28 are eligible to compete.
